What Are My Rights as a Voter With a Disability?

You have the right to vote

You can register to vote if you:

- 1. Are a U.S. Citizen**
- 2. Are 18 years old or older**
- 3. Have lived at your current address for at least 30 days**
- 4. Are not in prison or on parole for a felony conviction**
- 5. Are not claiming the right to vote in any other place**

You have the right to use your local polling place

You have the right to cast a secret ballot

You have the right to have someone help you mark and cast your ballot

You have the right to vote using an absentee ballot

You have the right to vote using an affidavit ballot if your name is not found in the poll book

You have the right to see a sample ballot from your County Board of Elections
